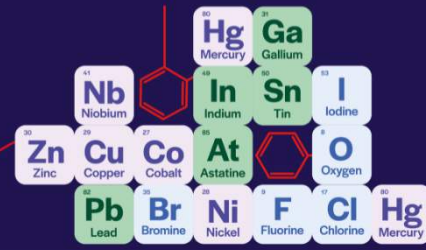

Congratulations Charlie - On Friday, Ignite student Charlie was announced as the winner of the Innovation Award at the TeenTech Awards at the IET in London. We are so proud of the way Charlie presented his VR BioSensory room and his incredible creativity and empathy in designing such a thoughtful and useful tool for children in hospital. Charlie's VR Biosensory room was created to help reduce anxiety in paediatric patients with long hospital stays. The VR Sensory room included sensor feedback so that it can adapt based on data from the user such as heart rate and eye movements providing a personalised experience for each user and catering to neurodiversity. Charlie got to share the stage with Rory Cellan-Jones and a robotic dog called spot by Boston Dynamics! What a great way to end the week.

Student Leaders - The StLT have created a student voice to go with our inclusivity assembly, Year 9 have been working on plans to help look after the environment in the surrounding area. They have met with staff and shared ideas on creating clean up teams and involving local businesses.

Young Women and Non Binary Students in Stem - The members of the Baker Dearing Trust Committee for Young Woman and Non-Binary Students in STEM were invited to speak to MPs at the Houses of Parliament yesterday. Kira and Ash enjoyed a fascinating tour of the Houses of Parliament, learning about the history of the palace and the functions and systems of government. The tour had a focus on the role of women, including interesting insights into the suffragettes movements. We then moved to Committee Room 9 where we were joined by six MPs; our local MP Kim Johnstone, the shadow Minister for Work and Pensions Matt Rodda, Siobhan Baillie, Sally -Ann Hart, Flick Drummond and Sir Robert Goodwill. There was a lively meeting, Kira engaged the MPs in discussion about engineering apprenticeships and Ash made points about barriers to entering careers in healthcare which the MPs were very interested to hear. We enjoyed lunch in the Houses of Parliament Café, then had a whistle stop tour around the area, taking in Whitehall, Downing Street, The Cenotaph, Trafalgar Square, Buckingham Palace and St James's Park. The day was exceptional, a privilege to be working with elected MPs to promote the UTC movement and the role of young women and non-binary students in STEM and a day none of us will forget.



Engineering Placements with MAST Group - Last Friday, Robert Lumb, Engineering Development Team Lead from Mast Group, one of our industry partners, joined us to interview Year 12 students for work experience placements. Students submitted a CV to Mast Group before the interview, and had a 30 minute interview slot where he asked questions and gave them a technical test on manufacturing techniques. The test was the same test he uses with university graduates and experienced engineers. He said "I was impressed with the technical knowledge of the students." He chose Calum and Paige for the placement in July! Both will be joining Mast Group's Engineering Research and Development Department for 1-week.



Social Sciences - All year 10 and 12 Social Scientists will have the exciting opportunity to gain first hand insights in to crime within the city of Liverpool. On Monday 10th July at 1pm in the cinema, a hate crime police officer and a sex work officer will be visiting the school to enrich the students understanding of crime and its relationship with ethnicity and gender.



Social Sciences Work Placements and Summer Plans - We have a number of students taking part in exciting work placements over the next two weeks including the law courts, visiting Cambridge University and a Nottingham Summer School Placement. Next week four of our students will be on work placement at St Teresa's Primary School.
